The following report summarizes documented and verified violations by the IGAD Monitoring and Verification Mechanism of the Cessation of Hostilities Agreement of 23 January 2014, for the period of 15 December 2014 – 31 January 2015.

As a result of investigations, and the weight of evidence collated it is the opinion of the JTC that Government Forces violated the following articles of the Cessation of Hostilities Agreement (CoHA), 23 January 2014 in Nassir from 29 December 2014 to 3 January 2015: 1.2b: refrain from taking any actions that could lead to military confrontations 3.1: refrain from attacks on the civilian population Actions by SPLM/A (IO) Forces went beyond what could be considered justifiable defensive measures and therefore also constituted violations of the CoHA of 23 January 2014 in Nassir from 29 December 2014 to 3 January 2015. 1.2b: refrain from taking any actions that could lead to military confrontations 	
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V023	8 January 2015	Jamam, Upper Nile State	On 8 January 2015 forces loyal to the SPLM/A (IO) attacked the village of Jamam. According to the agreements reached at the Cessation of Hostilities Implementation Workshop of 15-16 November 2014 Jamam was designated a 'Disputed Area' (DA 6) which had been verified by the MVM on 13 December 2014 as being under the control of the Government. As a result of investigations, and the weight of evidence collated it is the opinion of the JTC that SPLM/A (IO) Forces violated the following articles of the Cessation of Hostilities Agreement (COHA), 23 January 2014 in Jamam, Upper Nile State, on 8 January 2015: 1.1 – 1.2 complete (cessation of hostilities)	SPLM/A (IO) Forces

deliberately burnt down a mosque near the airstrip. When returning to barracks from the airstrip they set fire to several buildings in the market. Another building was burnt on 21 January. The issue of Government Forces burning tukuls and other buildings has been going on since the start of the dry season.	
As a result of investigations, and the weight of evidence collated it is the opinion of the JTC that Government Forces violated the following articles of the Cessation of Hostilities Agreement (COHA), 23 January 2014 in Nassir, Upper Nile State, on 19 and 21 January 2015: 3.1 The parties shall refrain from attacks on the civilian population and commit to the protection of human rights, life and <u>property</u> as provided by various national, continental and international instruments.
